

Vacancy for Ph.D. Professor - Department of Epidemiology of the School of Public Health of the University of São Paulo

The Dean of the School of Public Health of the University of São Paulo (FSP-USP) announces the opening call for the faculty position (full-time), specialty Epidemiology of non-communicable diseases.

Briefly, the position requires a commitment to teaching and extension activities and the ability to conduct independent research. Interested applicants should hold a Ph.D. granted or recognized by USP. Applications will be accepted between April 18th, 2024, at 09:00 a.m. to July 17th, 2024, at 11:59 p.m. (GMT-3). The entry-level monthly salary (MS3 level) is R\$ 14.761,02 plus benefits. The public exam will be held in Portuguese and covers the following program:

1. Descriptive studies and measures of occurrence of chronic non-communicable diseases;
2. Designs of observational epidemiological studies (ecological, cross-sectional, case-control, and cohort) applied to chronic non-communicable diseases;
3. Temporal trends and spatial distribution of the most prevalent chronic non-communicable diseases in Brazil;
4. Social inequalities by gender/sexuality, race/color, and socioeconomic status in the distribution of chronic non-communicable diseases;
5. Contextual and individual risk factors for chronic non-communicable diseases;
6. Information systems for monitoring chronic non-communicable diseases in Brazil;
7. Epidemiology in the proposition and evaluation of strategies to reduce the burden of chronic non-communicable diseases;
8. Demographic and epidemiological transition and their consequences for health systems;
9. Application of epidemiological methods for planning and managing the care of chronic non-communicable diseases;
10. Teaching and training in epidemiology of chronic non-communicable diseases: relevance of the topic, important points to be addressed, and current didactic strategies.

The entire application process - from the application to the result - will be ruled by the Brazilian constitutional principles, notably the rule of impersonality, and by the Statute and General Regulations of the University of São Paulo (USP) and by the Regulations of the School of Public Health.
